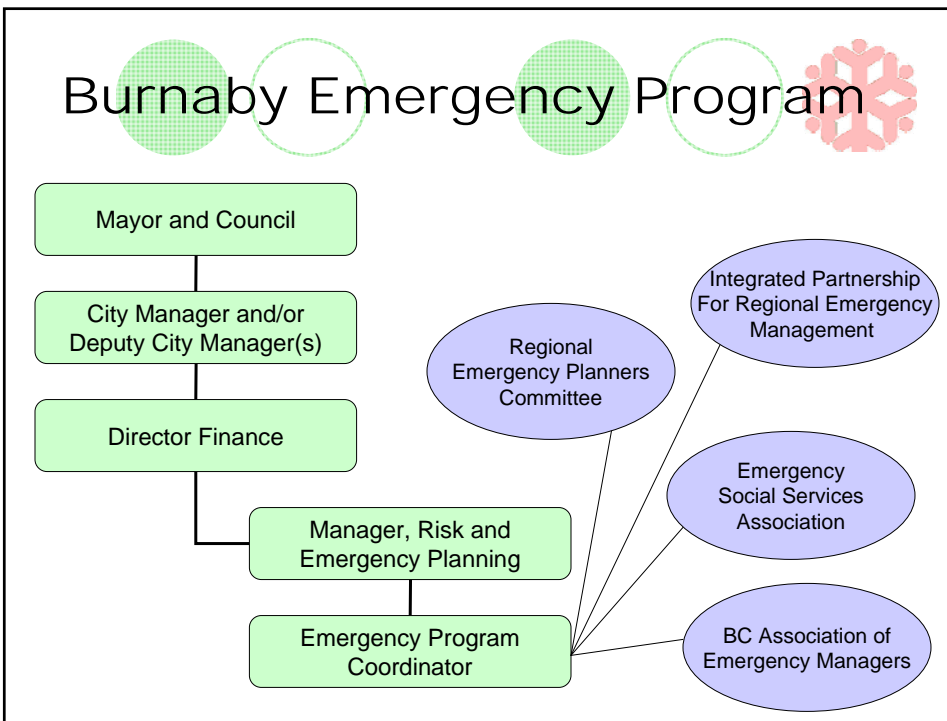

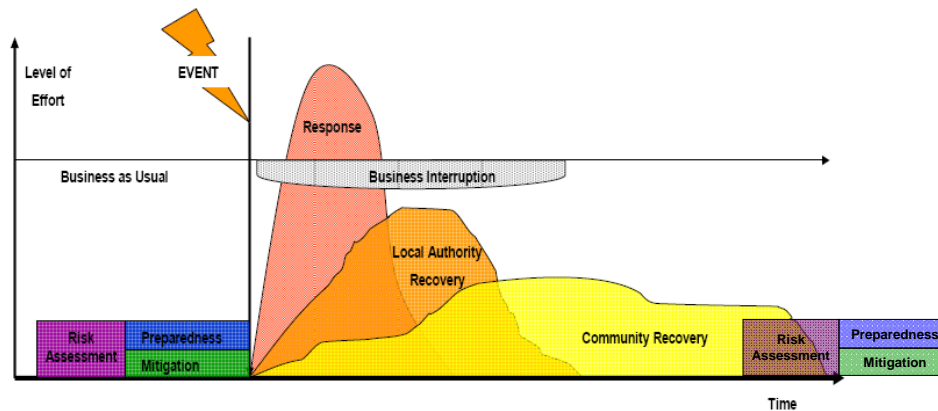

Mitigation and Prevention



Definition

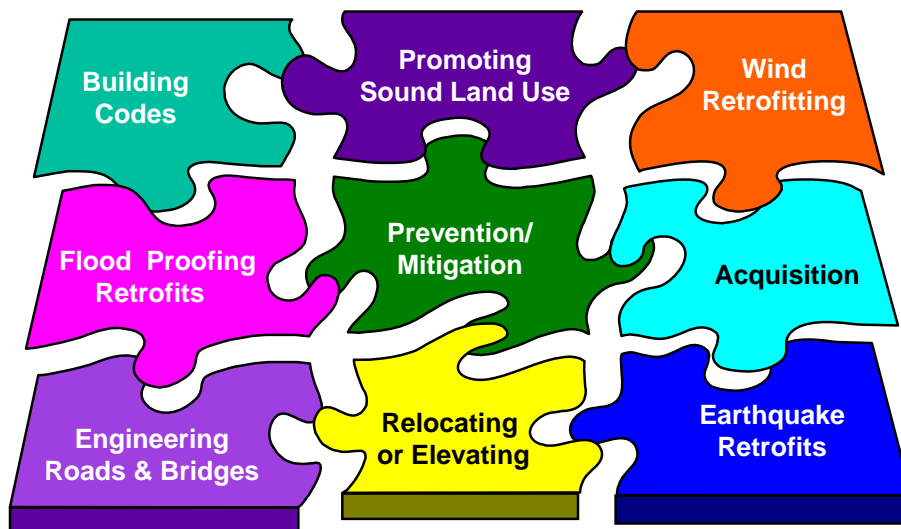
Mitigation

- Activities that can
 - save lives and reduce injuries
 - minimize future problems and costs

Prevention

- Activities and practices designed to
 - prevent an emergency or disaster
 - minimize the impact on the community

Mitigation and Prevention



Preparedness

Definition

- Process of ensuring that an organization
 - is ready to contain the effects of a disastrous event and minimize loss of life, injury, and damage to property
 - can provide rescue, relief, rehabilitation, and other services post-disaster
 - has the capability and resources to continue to sustain its essential functions without being overwhelmed



Preparedness Activities

- Training and exercising staff & volunteers and with industry partners
- Hazard, Risk, Vulnerability and Impact Analysis (HRVIA)
- Emergency response and recovery plans
- Hazard-specific emergency plans
- Mutual aid agreement development with neighbouring jurisdictions

Response

Definition

- The immediate actions needed to save lives and protect property
- The mobilization of the necessary emergency services and first responders into the emergency or disaster area



Who Might Respond

Public Notification Methods

- Web sites (www.burnaby.ca)
- Commercial media
- Emergency broadcasts
- Targeted alerts
- Door-to-door notification
- Printed materials
- Drive-by public address

Recovery

Definition

- A coordinated set of actions designed to reduce the effects of a disaster or emergency

Recovery

- Long-term actions to restore property, infrastructure and services
- 3B approach - Build Back Better
 - Rebuild/restore local infrastructure damaged during the emergency or disaster
- Community recovery program
 - Reduce human suffering & economic losses
 - Enhance a sustainable community
 - Protect community culture
